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Low Income Energy Efficiency

Overview

- Provides free weatherization and energy efficiency measures to eligible CA customers.
- Implemented by the regulated utilities (PGE, SDGE, SCG, & SCE) with CPUC oversight.
- Funded through a customer Public Goods Charge (PGC) surcharge on every customers' bill.
- Utilizes statewide coordination & cooperation with local agencies and CBOs.
- Leveraged with other programs, including federal LIHEAP program.
- Utilizes targeted outreach.

Goals

Low Income Sector

1. By 2020, all eligible customers will be given the opportunity to participate in the LIEE program.
2. The LIEE programs will be an energy resource by delivering increasingly cost-effective and longer-term savings.

Program Guidance

Low Income Sector

1. Whole Neighborhood Approach -- another tool to Marketing & Installation of LIEE Measures.
-- improved efficiencies and decrease costs.
2. Leveraging with other programs that serve the low income population.
-- increased customer enrollments, energy savings, or program savings.

- Cash rebates are offered to property owners and managers of existing residential dwellings that contain 2 or more units.
